11:30 -12:30 - 1:00: Break-out Sessions ---All participants will rotate through three 25 minute small group presentations

Breakout session A — Interior Design... Terry Buchanan will present pictures of five recent installations, each including a kitchen with adjacent living and dining areas which show the importance of unifying the entire space. She will review her clients' requirements and preferences that guided her design for each project. Samples of the materials used in each installation will be on display. In addition, there will a discussion of trends and tips for your kitchen project.

Breakout Session B — Appliances, New Technologies and Induction Cooking ...Linda Oliff-Rohleder will provide a PowerPoint presentation of the newly available

appliance trends, and discuss your specific needs as it relates to appliances. Linda has generously arranged for the exhibit of an energy efficient induction cook top, and **Chef Craig Sewell** will be demonstrating induction cooking. Chef Craig is a recognized expert in our area regarding sustainable foods and he will discuss the importance of sustainability as it relates to economic conservation.

Breakout Session C — Renewable, Recyclable Building and Materials...Mark Turner, Certified Green Remodeler, will present the issues regarding job site recycling and the use of renewable materials and resources by defining types of “green” insulations, gypsum and cement boards. Health and durability will be discussed regarding the use of eco-friendly low VC finishes and paints, flooring and countertops. Energy efficiency will be a topic of discussion as it relates to space planning and orientation of doors, windows, and skylights. The economical benefit of recycling and salvage will be exhibited by **Mark Foster** who represents Second Chance Architectural and Antiques Salvage Warehouse. In our throw-away world, buildings are only meant to last for 20 years, shingles are plastic and old-world craftsmanship is nearly impossible to find. Second Chance searches out old buildings that are entering the demolition phase. They rescue the wood, metal, marble, plaster, stone and other architectural elements that give these pieces new lives, in new homes, in new ways, with new uses. You will experience the fun of “reusables”!!!
